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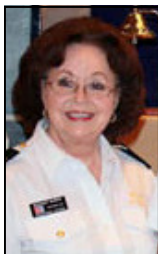
EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT**D/Lt/C Richard Littrell, JN**

Because of cost considerations, the Offshore Navigation Committee has no immediate plans to change the Navigation 2009 course to accommodate the magnetic variation correction recently introduced in The CAPN software program. That notice applies to mariners who use The CAPN for actual off-shore navigation. After a student has finished the course and is contemplating an off-shore cruise, correction for the changed variation should be made. However, if the change is made during the NAV 09 course, answers for the cruise and exam problems may be quite different from those using the current CAPN values.

USPS needs to look at our recruiting and retention practices. The easiest way to develop and use the items that have been or that are being developed and expanded is to remember the B.A.R.S. acronym:

Belong, Achieve, Recognize, Status

It is a simple concept but for some squadrons, one very hard to implement. It is the underlining theme of Membership Recruiting and Retention.

BELONGING is easy - just pay your dues - but considering yourself a true member or volunteer requires:

ACHIEVING something for your organization, receiving **RECOGNITION** by the organization, and finally achieving the **STATUS** that comes with being a recognized volunteer, committee chair, or officer.

It's often said that the Baby Boomers and Gen-X's don't want to volunteer. A question to answer is "How do you ask them to volunteer?" Just saying "would you please do this?" or "we need help" isn't enough. Most new members are too leery to jump in with both feet without specifics on what the event is all about, how much time they'll need to spend, the start and end times, and exactly what is expected of them.

Each squadron has to learn how to break an event into its smallest components and then ask people to help with each small task. Having a four-hour function with a bar? Have eight bartenders (one half-hour each) instead of one for four hours. Ask two or three people to greet people at a meeting, in addition to the people at the sign-in table. Put two couples in charge of a boating event instead of just one. The more people involved, the more fun had by all, and the larger the event becomes. People who start participating in an organization in a

small way very often end up being future leaders.

Recognition is very easy and very necessary. It needs to be more than a merit mark each year. The squadron membership needs to know who is working to make the squadron successful. An *individual* email to every person who helped, a "thank you" postcard, their names in the newsletter, or having them recognized at a meeting are just a few of the ways to recognize people who have helped in even small ways. And don't lump them all into one meeting a year - recognize the members at the next meeting right after the event. Larger volunteer efforts can be recognized with "Member of the Month", "Member of the Year" etc. These are all ways to let a membership know how valuable each volunteer is. One caution: every squadron has its unsung heroes, people who quietly do various jobs behind the scenes. Don't forget these people when you are recognizing members.

With recognition comes status. Status is an acknowledgement by the squadron that a member is a stakeholder in the squadron. This is simply another way of saying that they are an involved and valuable member. There are various levels of status - from "valuable member" to "committee member" to "committee chair" and finally, leader of a squadron. Members will stay at whatever status they are comfortable with, and trying to move them to a higher level could cause them to leave the squadron or retreat to inactive status.

A good motto to remember is "Volunteers are not paid not because they are worthless, but because they are priceless" and the USPS volunteers are worth their weight in gold. Without our volunteers, our squadrons and USPS could not exist. So get them to belong, help them achieve by participating in small tasks, recognize their achievements and the status of belonging to our great organization will be achieved by all.
