
Welcome—New Member Lorella M. Fazio





Do you have any children, grandchildren or friends who want to pilot a boat or drive a personal watercraft? Florida law states that anyone born on or after January 1, 1988 (35 or younger) who operates a vessel powered by 10 horsepower or more must pass an approved boater safety course and have in his/her possession photographic identification and a





boating safety education identification card issued by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FFWCC).

Our course is approved by the FFWCC and NASBLA. So send them to us.



America's Boating Channel Urges Use of Engine Cut-Off Devices

Are you aware of the legal requirement for using engine cut-off devices? This is a requirement that could save your life.



The requirement to use an engine cut-off switch (ECOS) took effect on April 1, 2021, and applies to all U.S. waterways, with fines of \$100, \$250, and \$500 for the first, second, and third offenses, respectively. State and local authorities may choose to enforce the law differently, but using an engine cut-off switch is now the law for qualified vessels everywhere in the United States.

The law applies to all personal watercraft and recreational boats under 26 feet with motors capable of 115 pounds of static thrust (a little under 3 horsepower). Boats not currently equipped



with an engine cut-off switch are exempt, but that grandfather clause is closing fast. Another recent federal law required manufacturers to install engine cut-off switches on all new boats starting in January 2020.

Videos are available that offer an overview of the importance of specialized safety equipment for recreational boating that will shut down the engine in an emergency such as the boat operator falling overboard. America's

Boating ChannelTM produced these videos to help viewers learn about traditional lanyard type devices, as well as the new wireless systems.

Watching videos like <u>"Engine Cut-Off Devices"</u> (https://youtu.be/3J3M8dMzqTk) is an excellent way for boaters to prepare for safer experiences on the water. America's Boating Channel also produced a sequel entitled <u>"Wear an ECOS"</u> (https://youtu.be/i0Nu7Gu-JG0). It covers differences between boating knowledge and boating skills and why it matters. Viewers learn approaches to take to improve their boating abilities.



The article on page 9 about "What's next for Boating Simulator Training" is from the Educational Department's *Currents* that was published at the 2022 Governing Board. The US Coast Guard transferred their grant from the BSVT to MuVIT in September 2022. MuVIT Boating, LLC was founded in November 2022 to receive the USCG funds. The United States Power Squadrons and MuVIT Boating signed their contract in February 2023.

Up until that point, MuVIT research and development had been solely funded by the Tampa Power Squadron. Sales of Generations 1-3 had been to squadrons, districts and USCG Auxiliary flotillas at cost plus shipping.

In April of this year, Scott and I joined forces with Tammy Brown, HQ Marketing Director, to present MuVIT at America's Boating Club table at the International Boating and Water Safety Summit (IBWSS) in Little Rock, AR.

This was the same event at which P/D/C Marty Lafferty, AP and P/C Sari S. Lafferty, AP

launched the 24x7 live streaming of America's Boating Channel.

What's next for Boat Simulation Training?

In 2013, USPS was awarded a US Coast Guard (USCG) grant to build a boating simulator for teaching boating skills to its members and the general public. With nine consecutive grants, the USCG has invested over \$1.2M in the development of the Boating Skills Virtual Trainer (BSVT).


BSVT was conceived originally by Bob Palmer when he observed his grandchildren playing with a racecar simulator at a Chuck E. Cheese and thought, "why can't we do this for boaters?" Bob directed the program for many years with Lisa Herndon Wilson as project manager, working with our partner, Virtual Driver Interactive (VDI), to hone the exercises.

George Hallenbeck took over the reins as project manager in 2017 and over the course of the program, well over 17,000 students have been documented as users, with hundreds of others observing and participating.

George recently retired from this role; Lisa continues to work with the 23 fullsized BSVT units. VDI was acquired by Cemtrex, Inc. So, what is next on the horizon for training boating skills through simulation?

Concurrently over the years, Scott Morris worked with the Tampa Squadron to internally develop a laptop version called MuVIT™, the Multi-Vessel Interactive Trainer, using off-the-shelf software. MuVIT is now in its 4th generation and provides an economical trainer which is easily transportable and very versatile.

The platform has numerous advanced features to assist the boating educator and provide a visual draw at public events such as boat shows. The MuVIT™ software supports single or dual throttle operation, multiple types of vessels, including power, sail and PWC, with highly sophisticated features and functions suitable for a wide range of boating experience from beginner to advanced.



A beginner can practice docking and maneuvering in various wind, visibility, sea, and current situations which can be adjusted on the fly, including restricted visibility, and demonstrating wave crossing, as well as running before the waves, and demonstrating what happens in a beam sea. You can also interconnect multiple machines allowing students to practice such activities as crossing, overtaking, and close-quarters maneuvering. The trainer has scenery that allows the user to see and properly use navigational aids such as dayboards, buoys, and ranges.

The MuVIT™ platform has several features which make it ideal for some advanced navigation classes. Because it is based on a real-world global coordinate system, you can operate in local scenery, and the Latitude and Longitude are correct for the location. This is an important feature as the software allows for an NMEA interface with OpenCPN which then displays the vessel on OpenCPN charts as it operates.

It also comes with an integrated chartplotter that allows for the creation of waypoints and routes. The display shows not only course and speed over ground, and all the usual data, but also

the heading and distance to the next waypoint. There are several GPS modes available besides the chartplotter, including the traditional numeric display, and compass. For the purposes of teaching, the ability to send the GPS/ Chartplotter to a separate display is quite useful.

The software includes a sophisticated radar simulator that can track the operating vessels. The radar has a full complement of operating controls that function as one would expect from a real-world unit. These include gain, and range rings, as well as sea and rain clutter filtering. The electronic bearing line (EBL) and variable range mark (VRM) facilitate teaching the skill of getting a radar fix. You can teach a complete radar seminar using MuVIT™ and the ability to configure the system to send the radar display to a separate display is a bonus.



HOMOSASSA RIVER/SOCIAL OUTING


21 May 2023

wound around making it difficult to determine where you should be. I'm glad Tom was driving. After we went through a section called *Hell's Gate* we turned around and made our way back to the marina.


